He enjoyed all of these up to the days before he passed. Cremation has taken place. A memorial

“ I have been blessed to have Bernie as my friend for almost 13 years, which doesn't seem like a long time but it was impactful. I have never met anyone like him, him and I were a lot alike, almost 2 peas in a pod. We found trouble together. He gave me missions to complete, which I always did eagerly. If only Bernie had learned computer skills and google, we would have all been in trouble. Bernie was old-school, he was a story teller. He loved to talk and I loved to listen. I would listen to him for hours. Bernie was comfort, and that was felt just being around him. He was smart. He had experiences. He shared his life, his memories of childhood, early married life and all of his family with me. His classmates, his neighbours, his old coworkers all became part of my life. I would wait to hear more about them all. When he told stories, it usually involved something of the 'oh that was a few years ago now', and sometimes those years were well before I was born. It didn't matter. I heard tales from St Jerome's, the stockyards. Baxter's. I heard about life on the farm. The move into 'town'. His cats. (I am certain all the talks we had about his barn cats convinced me to bring some home). I heard about the Hesson church, the school trustee days and trips into Listowel where a piece of raisin pie was a treat. He would talk about the way things used to be and the way things should still be. You could ask Bernie any question and you knew he was giving you an honest answer. But the most important stories he told involved his wife his children and his grandchildren and even the great grandchildren. He pretended to be a little hard, but he knew.... he knew birthdays and special occasions. The love and the pride he had for his family was so apparent. It was a life that most people could only dream of being a part of. Cathy in education, Terry with his long (recently ended) career, Tom as a trucker, Karry and her manufacturing career, Kelly and the potato peeling and Tim following his older brother at FAG....He was so very proud. Bernie was sentimental. He was inspirational. Still working when many others would have been happy to be retired and doing nothing. The drives around the neighbourhood keeping updated on any changes. Chasing and moving cows, fixing fences, firewood, yard maintenance. He

wouldn't be stopped. He lived a long, good life. He loved and was loved. He was able to take the time to enjoy life over the last six months.
